About the University of Guelph-Humber



Part-time Online Study

All of your courses are online. The majority of courses are six weeks long and most semesters you take one course at a time for a total of two per semester. You complete six courses over three semesters in one calendar year.

Based on the transfer credit you receive at the point of admission, you can expect to complete your degree within two to two and a half calendar years. Courses include Ethics and the Justice System; Public Policy; Leadership and Motivation; and Introduction to Organizational Behaviour. Transfer Credit

All successful applicants receive 7.0 or 9.0 credits.

Your transfer credit will be assessed on an individual basis.

Transfer credit	Based on
5.0	Postsecondary coursework (equivalent to one year of full-time study). Required.
2.0	Minimum of three years of full-time related work experience. Required.
2.0	Completed recruit/induction training, as listed below, can be considered for additional credit. Not required.

An official Transfer Credit Assessment will be sent at the point of offer and will detail credit granted.

Specific professional training (not required)

If you have completed recruit/induction training at any of the facilities below, you may receive 2.0 additional credits:*

- Ontario Police College (or equivalent out-of-province training)
- Military Police Depot
- RCMP Depot
- Corrections Canada Training Program at the RCMP Depot
- Ontario Correctional Services College (or equivalent out-of-province training)
- Canada Border Services Agency's Officer Induction Training

- OR If you have completed one of the trainings listed below, you may receive 2.0 additional credits:*
 - An Advanced Care Paramedic Certificate
 - Successful completion of a one-year Ontario public college Pre-Service Firefighter Program (or equivalent)
 - Certification at the National Fire Protection Association 1001 Firefighter and 1021 Fire Officer levels (or equivalent)
 - NFPA 1031 (Fire Inspector)
 - NFPA 1033 (Fire Investigator)
 - NFPA 1035 (Fire and Life Safety Educator, Public Information Officer)
 - Fire Services Executive Management Certificate from Humber

^{*}If you have completed more than one of the accepted training options listed above, you cannot receive more than 2.0 credits for professional training towards your degree.

Admission Requirements

Postsecondary education

A recognized college diploma in an academic field with a minimum 70% cumulative average, or at least 10 university-level courses with a minimum 65% cumulative average.

+

Work experience

A minimum of three years of full-time work experience in a related field.

Meeting all admission requirements does not guarantee admission.

How to Apply

Select ONE of two ways to apply:

- If you are applying only to the University of Guelph-Humber and/or the University of Guelph, you can apply for up to two programs (between the two institutions) for a reduced OUAC application fee of \$95. Apply at ouac.on.ca/apply/ guelphugrad/transfer.
- If you are applying to multiple universities, then apply at ouac.on.ca.
 The OUAC application fee is \$156 for up to three program/university choices.

Important: Whenever accessing your application/account on the OUAC, please use the link you applied with throughout the admission process.

Program code: Select "GMU".

Assessment fee: You will pay an assessment fee of \$95.

Deadline to apply: June 1, 2025

Required documents: You must submit required documents, as indicated on your WebAdvisor account, by **June 15, 2025**. Document details available at **guelphhumber.ca/futurestudents/jps-apply**.

Tracking your application

Once we've received your application, we will send you your login and password to WebAdvisor. This online system allows you to see what documents are required and if they have been received by the University.

Admission decision

You can expect to receive a decision within three weeks of submitting all your required documents. If you receive an offer email, instructions on how to accept your offer will be included.

Scholarships & Tuition

As an applicant, you are automatically considered for our **Entrance Scholarship for Part-time Programs**.
