## What courses do I need **to complete** in order **to graduate**?

The BAA degree consists of **15.0 credits (30 courses)**. Students admitted into this program will receive transfer credits based on their educational and professional experience.

Students who were admitted into this program **with previous training** with the OPC, the Military Depot, the RCMP depot or similar government training institution will receive 9.0 transfer credits (18 courses) and must complete **12 courses** within this program.

Students who **have not received training** at the OPC, the Military Depot, the RCMP depot or a similar credited government training institution will receive between 7.0 to 8.5 transfer credits (14 to 17 courses). They will need to complete between **13 to 16 courses** depending on the number of transfer credits that is received.

## How are **classes delivered**?

Classes delivered in an **online format** on [Course Link](#). No physical classroom attendance is required.

## Am I required to complete a **field placement**?

No. BAA Justice and Public Safety students are **granted transfer credit** for all field placement courses in the program.
