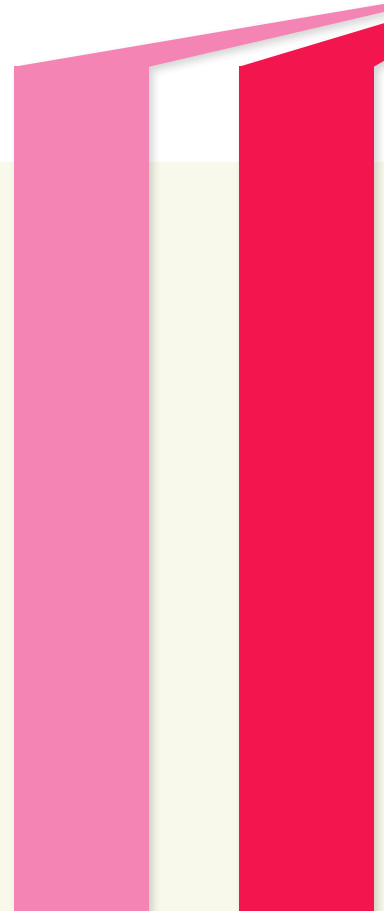





We acknowledge

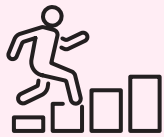

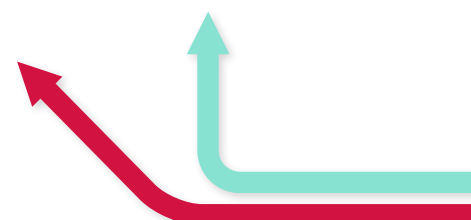

Full-time study on campus

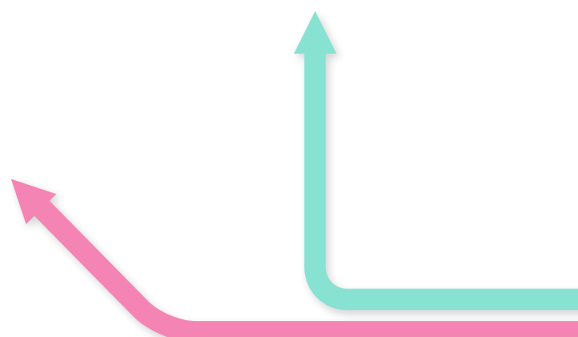

Bachelor of Applied Arts specialization in Justice & Public Safety from University of Guelph (for working professionals)

Highlights

Students in this program work in law enforcement, correctional services, fire and emergency services, and other public safety sectors, and range from relatively new employees to managers, command staff and senior executives.

- Part-time online
- Study anywhere online with no set lecture times
- Graduate in two/two and a half years (dependent on your transfer credit assessment)
- A critical thinking and research-based academic foundation to complement and expand your experience
- Introduces you to diverse organizations and opens networking among peers

Admission requirements

Work experience: A minimum of three years of professional full-time work experience in a related field.

+ Postsecondary education: A recognized college diploma in an academic field with a minimum 70% cumulative average or completed at least 10 degree-level courses with a minimum 65% cumulative average.

Meeting admission requirements does not guarantee admission.

Transfer credit

Your transfer credit will be assessed after you have submitted all required documents. An official Transfer Credit Assessment will be included at the point of admission and will detail credit granted. All successful applicants are eligible to receive 7.0 or 9.0 credits.

Q: What's the connection between Netflix and Guelph-Humber?

A: Bill C., U of GH alumnus

Bill Courtice was the Lead Investigator for the case highlighted in *What Jennifer Did*, the spring 2024 hit documentary on Netflix.

Now retired, Bill had the opportunity to share his perspective on the 2010 local homicide with the world. The case came to a close in 2014.

Work while studying

With more than 33 years in law enforcement with the military and York Regional Police (YRP), Bill decided to fulfill his plans to earn a degree.

In 2015, while working as a Detective with the YRP Homicide Unit, Bill completed his Bachelor of Applied Arts at Guelph-Humber.

Bill went on to graduate studies at the University of Guelph. He became an Investigator in YRP's Cold Case Unit and, after retiring, has taken up teaching.



My memorable moments were the experience of going to GH and sharing the academic journey with my cohort. It is difficult to put into words the importance of in-class discussions and debates, which opens the mind to critical thinking.

I became a better critical thinker.

Furthering your education is critical to your career. There are some great instructors at Guelph-Humber, who provide a different perspective... They had a lot to give... I gained skills I didn't have prior [to my degree] and enhanced skills I already had.



Admission Requirements



College block credit transfer pathways

When you apply, you are considered for block credit if you are in your final year of diploma completion or have a completed diploma that qualifies for block credit, as noted on the program pages (4 to 13). Through your diploma, you fulfill the high school subject requirements for the respective program. All applicants are individually evaluated.

Program	Minimum cumulative average to apply
Business	Low to mid-70s
Community Social Services	Low to mid-70s
Early Childhood Studies	Low to mid-70s
Justice Studies	Low to mid-70s
Kinesiology	75% – If your average is 70–74.9%, a support letter is required for consideration
Media and Communication Studies	Low to mid-70s
Psychology	Low to mid-70s



General transfer

When you apply, you are considered for general transfer admission if you have previous postsecondary education (i.e., coming from university or college with one course or more) but do not have one of the college diplomas considered for block credit.

Admission average

Coming from a college diploma program, you must have a minimum cumulative average of low to mid-70s to be considered. If you are applying with degree-level coursework (from college or university), you must present a minimum cumulative average of 65% for consideration.

Subject requirements

- ENG4U (or equivalent) for all programs
- Any 4U math for Business only

You may have completed equivalent subject requirements through your coursework, which will be determined by your transcripts once you apply. How to Apply



Apply online

Apply online at the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC).

Important

- **You must** use the same web link you applied with to access your OUAC application throughout the admission process.
- Document evaluation fees apply.

Choose one of two ways to apply:

Option A

If you are applying only to the University of Guelph-Humber and/or the University of Guelph, transfer applicants can apply for up to two programs (between the two institutions) for a reduced application fee. This application is facilitated by the OUAC on behalf of the University of Guelph-Humber. Go to ouac.on.ca/apply/guelphugrad/transfer.

– OR –

Option B

If you are applying to multiple universities then go to ouac.on.ca to start the application process.



Rank your preference

If you apply to more than one program at the University of Guelph-Humber, you can expect to receive only one offer of admission from the University. Only in the event that you are not admissible to your highest choice will your next choice be considered. If you want to reorder your U of GH program rankings, please amend your application on the OUAC web page/link you used to apply with.

ESL

English language requirements

If your first language is not English, or if you have completed less than four years of study in English at the secondary or postsecondary level, then you are required to submit proof of English proficiency. You will receive an email with detailed instructions (after you apply) if you are required to demonstrate English proficiency as part of your application. Submit documents

Once we've received your application, we will email further instructions about how to check WebAdvisor (our online student administration system) for required documents. Below is a general list as a guide for applicants.

- Official in-progress and/or final transcripts (required); please submit requested unofficial documents via WebAdvisor; all official transcripts can be sent via the OUAC, when possible.
- Education Declaration (may be required)
- English proficiency results (if applicable)
- Detailed course syllabi (may be required)
- Support letter (may be required)

Please submit all required documents as soon as possible, and no later than the document deadline, to allow for timely review of your application.



Admission decision

Applicants to most programs can expect to receive a decision approximately three to six weeks following the submission of all required documents.



Your offer

Your digital offer will include an official Offer of Admission, scholarship estimate (if applicable) and conditions of your offer. Your official Transfer Credit Assessment will be emailed to you within a few business days after your official Offer of Admission.

Accept your Offer of Admission online through the OUAC using the link/process by which you applied.



Transfer Credit Assessment

Your Transfer Credit Assessment is an official document that outlines the credit you will receive from courses completed at other postsecondary institutions towards your credentials earned at the University of Guelph-Humber. Your assessment will include a link to the Program Plan that will help identify the remaining courses to complete.

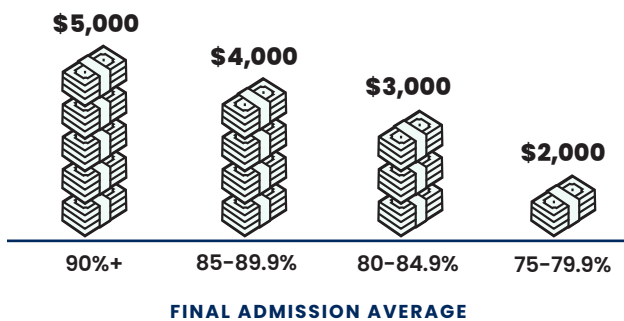

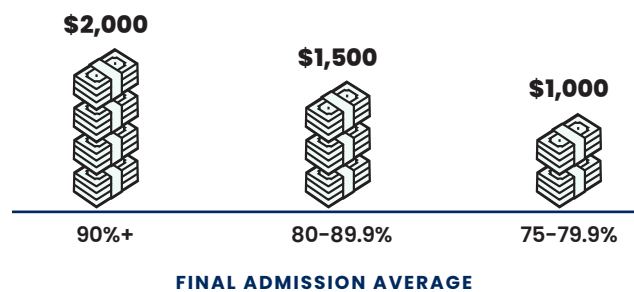
