





Admission Terminology

Admission average: For high school applicants, your admission average is calculated using your top six 4U/M courses (or equivalent), including your subject requirements. When all 4U/M grades are not available, we use a combination of your top six completed or in-progress 4U/M and completed 3U/M courses, including required subjects, for all rounds of offers.

Estimated cut-off admission range: Estimated cut-off ranges are based on the admission averages from previous years and are provided as a point of reference. Exact cut-offs for the current admission cycle will be determined by the quantity and quality of applications received and the number of spaces available in the respective program. Possession of an admission average within the estimated cut-off range does not guarantee an offer of admission. If you have been educated outside of Canada, your eligibility will be assessed on an individual basis.

Offers of admission: Offers are sent on an ongoing basis from December until the end of May. All applicants will receive an admission decision by May 29, 2025. Your final grades, once received, must fulfill the conditions of your offer. Ontario and BC high school applicants can check the grade data sent through their OUAC account. **Student Profile (SP):** The Student Profile offers you an opportunity to tell us about factors that may have impacted your grades. You are encouraged to complete the SP if your average is within a discretionary range of the determined cut-off (up to 5%).

Supplementary Information Form for Students with Disabilities (SIF-D): If you identify as a student with disabilities and your admission average does not meet the cut-off for the program to which you have applied, your SIF-D may be considered if your average is within a discretionary range of the determined cut-off (up to 5%). Optional to complete.

Repeated courses, summer school, night school and correspondence: The University will use the highest grade reported for Grade 12 courses taken at a Ministry-approved school prior to June 2025, regardless of format.

Deferrals: Application available in June; please visit our website for detailed deferral information.

English language requirements: If your first language is not English, or if you have completed less than four years of study in English at the secondary (or postsecondary) level, then you are required to submit proof of English proficiency. For full details, please visit our website.

You will receive an email with detailed instructions (after you apply) if you are required to demonstrate English proficiency as part of your application.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

- Minimum academic score of 24
- Reported bonus points will be taken into consideration
- Three Higher Level and three Standard Level courses, including specific subject requirements for the program to which you are applying
- Any Higher Level or Standard Level mathematics course is acceptable for programs that require math
- You are eligible to receive a maximum of 2.0 credits for grades of 5 or better on Higher Level courses.







